Periodically I've written in the Breeze outlining my philosophy on this Series, the results and progress of the Fun Races, so you have heard it all before.

Whether you are a new skipper or old skipper with new crew or just for the love of Sailing, I'm sure we can all gain more by often getting the boat off the dock. The Fun Race series is less serious way of learning about your boat at all points of sail, under all wind and seascape conditions.

It was a little disappointing, that we could only get 3-5 boats on the start line consistently in the 2023 season. We had 28 races scheduled of which about 20 were sailed in good conditions. In the final scoring we dropped 10 races

Without taking away from Didgeridoo's performance because the boat was sailed well, but, I believe Didge won the trophy because the boat raced more often than others. You don't have to even win a majority of the races. Consistency is the key.

In conclusion I would like to see more boats in the 2024 and I hope there is another name on this trophy next season.
