Aids to Navigation

You may recall, a one of our Virtual Information Nights, information was provided by one of our DYC members to support an initiative to work with DFO to add an Aids to Navigation to the end of our west side pier. You may have participated in a survey that helped to build a case and now, I am happy to report that we have received word that the following changes will be made. Here's the letter I received in January regarding the changes we can look forward to.

ids to Navigation

Good afternoon, Leigh,

I would like to inform you that the recommendations for the AtoN Level of Service Review for Port Dalhousie have been approved and we are moving onto the implementation phase. We will be making the following changes to the aids to navigation at the entrance to the main harbour:

LL 539, Port Dalhousie (lighthouse on east pier):

Light colour will be changed to green.

Flash character will remain Iso 4s.

Intensity will be increased from 189 cd to 300 cd.

LL 7000.016, Pt. Dalhousie Starboard Day beacon (west pier):

This will be changed from a day beacon to a starboard hand minor lighted aid.

Light colour red.

Flash character (Fl)4s

Following the implementation of the changes I would like your and other DYC members feedback on their effectiveness.

I will keep you posted on timelines for the changes to be implemented.

Should there be any questions from yourself or members of DYC please don't hesitate to ask.

Symbols that identify inclusion in a group appear early in any organization. The fundamental identifier for DYC is our burgee. The elements of the triangular pennant with the letters DYC are copied onto our cap badges and crests.



No burgees were evident in the pictures of the club boats shown in the Standard's coverage of the beginnings of the club in 1937. But the accompanying, rather florid, text from the print article accompanying the pictures begins with

"The red and white burgee whips from the masthead as the breeze freshens, and a slim boat heels over and gathers way with the grace of a bird, it's big sails taking full advantage of the change in the air"

The presence of electronic instruments at the masthead has prompted the moving of a club burgee from the masthead onto the starboard spreader.





From Our DYC PHRF-LO Officer . . .

Highlights of PHRF-LO, AGM held on Jan 21,2023

- 1. If you use the PHRF-LO handicap rating which is the intellectual property of PHRF-LO, you should expect to pay for it. Boat owners who race, are encouraged to pay the annual fee so that PHRF-LO can continue to research latest changes in technology and provide accurate ratings for your boat in the interest of fairness.
- 2. The annual fee for belonging to PHRF-LO by member Clubs is based the number of boats registered in the previous year and is due in February. The charge of \$46.00 is very reasonable when compared to membership into class associations and other handicapping authorities.
- 3. When sailing in one design fleets, PHRF certificates are not required. However, when a one design boat is sailing in a PHRF fleet, a valid certificate is necessary. A Class Association Fee, such as a Kirby 25, Shark or Laser 28, does not include a valid PHRF certificate. The PHRF certificate needs to be applied for separately.
- 4. Currently only open events are served by PHRF-LO. Boats who are registered with member clubs may race with their home club or any other member club using the same valid certificate.
- 5. Valid PHRF-LO certificates are issued annually to include any adjustments to the ratings brought about by rule changes or improved data.
- 6. Race data is constantly monitored by PHRF-LO based on reports submitted by Nov 15 each year by participating clubs. The Race Analysis is submitted for any boat, with a valid certificate, which participates in three or more Club sanctioned races in the season. Approved races constitue windward leeward courses in which three or more boats (per fleet) participate in steady winds greater than 3 knots.

Relevant current measurement data to establish the rating for any particular boat includes - measurement of all mains - measurement of the maximum size headsail - re-measurement of spinnakers to provide mid girth (MG), rather than maximum girth figures.

Minimum MG to be not less than 75% of foot. (2022) - confirmation of symmetrical with pole or asymmetrical spinnaker with a bow sprit - bloopers, streakers including Code 0 sails are prohibited. - confirmation of mode of propulsion - confirmation of the type of keel. - use of carbon fibre spars. (2022)

Future Projects include - refinement of point to point sailing ratings - study into how electric drives change the ratings - collection of new data based on keel changes.

Floating dock repairs: Existing floating docks currently sitting in B yard have several issues





Mast crane review and possible refit proposal:

We want to review the state of the mast crane and then plan any desired repairs and propose potential upgrades. If you are interested or have experience with mast crane assessments don't hesitate to contact me!

Club Kirby reconditioning: With the comeback of the Learn to Sail program and enthusiasm for racing and dry-sailing from A yard, we are looking to assess and potentially recondition the two club Kirby 25s (Ali Cat and Under Cover). There is a proposal in development for a Sea Scout Leadership Project in which a high school student would contribute to the management and documentation of a Kirby reconditioning project. We have gathered a Committee of Kirby superstars to watch over the project but we will be looking for volunteers to carry out the work on the vessels later this spring.

Learn To Sail Building: Many of the tasks associated with restating the Learn to Sail program and other work projects involve the Learn To Sail building. We have started substantial work reorganizing the contents of that building and are now discussing the various uses that it could provide to the club. If you have ideas, or want to be involved in a group to actively discuss the possibilities, reach out to me. Also, if you happen to know someone with a ping-pong table that needs a new home I think that we have room for it!






