

Hello DYC Members, Family and Friends,


June has been a very busy month for so many of you and I am happy to announce the opening of the westside washrooms!


Rear-Commodore's Report...

Well, it's official, summer is here and DYC is in full swing. Thank You to all that helped with Sail Past this year. I'm so incredibly





This year I look forward to seeing Cameron and our Harbour staff really show off their excellence and I'm thankful to the persevering minds of the past to push hard to replace our aging in ground fuel tanks with new above ground tanks. Those decisions were made at a time when DYC was not in a good place both financially and with declining membership. Having a reliable fuel delivery system (including some upgrades to our fuel hose reels this season), has allowed us to become a destination for fuel on the entirety of Lake Ontario. Much thanks must also go to our previous HO supervisors Dan and Diederik and to Cameron currently, for fostering the relationships with the large boat captains, as well as Dave Bellhouse for the many years of holding the HO together with limited staff, out dated infrastructure and limited fuel sales due to pier construction, high water and declining membership. 90% of the transactions that happen at the Harbour Office are for non-members.

The last 3 seasons have been spent modernizing our POS and inventory tracking systems, as well as our harbour management systems, increasing our staffing and focusing on consistent and reliable customer service with easy to communicate operating hours. I am incredibly proud of our staff. They have really risen to the challenge laid ahead of them and the comments we receive from members and visitors alike have been awesome. I hope everyone realizes how lucky we are to have such an amazing group.

The HO is in good hands with Cameron and I know that Jason Matsugu will be an incredible help to him continuing all of the hard work of the previous seasons.





We must now shift focus to other areas of our club and the biggest piece that we have right now is the state of our docks, "A" dock specifically. The Flag as well as Yard and Docks will be doing a wholesome review of the state of our current docks this summer. The plan is to have an idea of what we "think we want" by fall and and RFP put out to dock manufacturers in October with a request to them to tell us what we need. If all goes well, the intention is to start with A dock in spring 2024. Inevitably there will be many, many ideas of what we need and what we want. We need your input. Please contact myself, Leigh or PJ with your "hopes and dreams" as we will be compiling everyone's input into a workable plan.

I am looking forward to doing my first ever cruise (and with the family too!) this year to 50 Point and am grateful to Sandra Chave for picking up the reins from Val in organizing our club cruises this year. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to our cruise directors (past and present), as it is a ton of work organizing all the different clubs that want to visit us as well as wrangling our members to leave the docks and try somewhere new. It was difficult in the shadow of COVID, but brighter days are here so sign up and go exploring!

This is the second season LTS is back and the first year since COVID that the weekday camps are back. A huge thank you to Marion for all of her efforts bringing back this important piece to DYC and to Kiki Klassen who showed us a new way to think about how to teach youth off the beach. 



We have been considering the option of putting in a pickleball court for over a year now. With limited paved options here at the club, the best solution was the paved area in Yard "A". We set out last year and looked at the area and determined a court is viable in this area given the fencing at the street and the pier. With limited traffic, safety is not an issue. Given the proximity to the restaurant spectators and players have beverage and meal options. The project has covered a small portion of A yard and will not hinder use of any other activities

The court will introduce members to the sport of pickleball and encourage play. The sport of pickleball has been growing exponentially over the past few years and has become a sport that is both entertaining to play and to watch. All ages can play, and play with each other. Scott and I will offer our time to coach anyone interested in playing. We are considering 2 times per week and offer more time when members are excited to play.

We are also setting up a temporary court for West Side Washroom Grand Opening. You can learn some of the basic play, watch some games, grab a paddle and play. So come out and get your game on!
