Lastly, Dan Switzer will not be returning this year as he has decided to pursue a full-time, year-round career. We wish Dan every success as he served the club very well last season.



What Youth Participants are Eligible

To be eligible, youth must:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment*;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment**; and,

have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations

Student Dock Attendant's main job duties include operating of a marina fuel dock, greeting all boaters, attending to member/customer concerns and maintaining club facilities and grounds.

Responsibilities:

- Greet visitors, ascertain nature of business and provide direction to visitors
- Perform multiple daily dock walks to check on vessels, vacancies, customers and dock conditions and safety
- Monitor docks and vessels during inclement weather
- Assist guests with docking and departures
- Ensure area is clean; empty garbage receptacles and pick up litter
- Ensure any work area is kept clean and clear of any potential hazards such as slippery objects ortripping hazards such as ropes or debris
- Respond to customer requests for fuel
- Take payments for docking/fuel
- Other duties as assigned





Preparation for all boat owners means:

- * Four 30' dock lines attached, bow & stern, port & starboard.
- * Engine test run prior to lift, ensure there is enough fuel in it to get to assigned dock.
- * Prepare for rain; decision to delay is up to launch crew.
- * Have fenders on deck ready to deploy when boat is in water.
- * Check through hulls for leaks when in the travel well.
- * Do not start your engine until you are asked.
- * Move boat to assigned dock, secure and return to C yard to flatten, tie your cradle, and help other members. A DYC shuttle will be available if needed.
- * Remove pads, ladder, cover and all assorted cleaning equipment etc. from your site. Check around your storage area to be sure it is clean + free of sharps.
- * 2 club ladders will be available as your boat is being launched for last minute access. There should be no personal ladders on or about your cradle as your boat is lifted. Your cradle will be moved while your boat is in the lift, ladders impede the yard crew and may get damaged.
- * It would be helpful for members to take recyclables and assorted rubbish home.

Some examples of help that will be needed:

- handle dock lines at travel lift bay
- skipper whaler or Avon to ferry members across harbor or tow boats if needed
- knock down and tie up cradles
- put blocking and jack stand on pallets or out of the way
- remove water lines
- get fuel for travel lift or tractor and things we haven't yet thought of.




FUN RACING

Racing starts as listed, May 15, Sunday at 1000 and Tuesday May 17 at 1800. If the marks are not laid, the date will be delayed 1 week. The first 2 races shall be deemed practice as some boats will not be ready due to the launch date.

If you wish to try racing and are not sure, it was decided to allow participation for 2 races without a valid PHRF Certificate. If after you decide you want continue the fun, you will need to pay the fee and receive a certificate, so that you can be scored.

PHRF CERTIFICATES

For those skippers requiring a PHRF Certificate:



- for racing this season and have never been issued a Certificate before;
- have a current certificate that was issued prior to 2019;
- are changing fleets from NFS to FS and need their spinnaker measured;

Bring your sails to the DYC clubhouse on May 07 between 0900 and 1200. Bring only the sails you intend to use for racing; your main, your largest headsail and your asymmetric or symmetrical spinnaker. If you

are launching that day, you are welcome to drop them off to us and we will get them measured up for you.

This season PHRF-LO have amended the measurement of the spinnaker from maximum girth to mid-girth. For most boats a remeasure will not alter your rating, however if you intend to do any serious interclub racing or regattas, a remeasure will be required for a valid 2022 certificate.

If you have significantly modified or added anything new to the hull, prop or rig configuration, then you should report the change to DYC to enable us to adjust and validate your certificate for 2022.

PARKING FOR DYC MEMBERS

ON THE EAST SIDE, THE DYC CLUBHOUSE SIDE

DYC Parking on the east side of the harbour is available in the open lot between the Harbour Office and Learn to Sail building, "B Yard".

"C Yard," where the travel lift is kept is also an option, once the boats have all been launched and the cradles are stored away. This lot is semi-secure. Coordination may be required depending on any work being done to maintain / enhance this space throughout the summer and for winter storage.

Access to your boat on the west side can include:

The DYC Boat Shuttle will run when the Harbour Office (HO) is open. When staffed, request transport from one of our harbor office staff.

Dingy – use your dinghy if you have one to make your way back and forth to the west side from the east side of the harbor.

Take a lovely walk around the harbour on the Waterfront Trail ~ 15 minute walk.

ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE HARBOUR (THE TOWN SIDE)

Beach / Lakeshore park Parking ~ May1st to October

St. Catharines / Port Dalhousie Residents - \$15 season parking pass, limit 2 per family/household, vehicles register to a home in St. Catharines.

You can use only one car at a time.

Anyone else \$3 Per Hour rate / maximum 3 hours.

There is overnight parking in Lakeside park from 9pm to 8am, as the parking restrictions are not enforced between those times.

6 Spots ~ West Side B Dock

Aim to use these spots for unloading provisions, drop offs and short day stays, as there is limited space. Please park on the East Side for longer stays, overnights, weekends and cruising.

6 Spots ~ by the Harbour Club (HC) Sales Office

We will need to reissue parking passes again this year for HC space. There is no gate and it won't be locked. The much larger Lincoln Fabrics area that we used last year is now a construction site and is not available to us, we CANNOT use this area.





History of the Canada Games

The Village at Brock University will provide accommodations, meals and services specific to athletes, coaches and their supports. Participants will be bused to venue.

The Games are bilingual – we will have signage in both languages and our lead for languages is Stephane Dupervil– who will be onsite to make announcements in French.

All staff and volunteers will be wearing the same uniform so spectators, athletes, coaches, and sponsors will know who to go to for assistance.

The Games will provide security for the tents, boats and equipment while they are on site.

Racing Information

The racing area must be in Canadian waters, therefore west of the river mouth.

The racing area has to be southeast of the downbound traffic lane to Welland Canal.

The racing area should avoid the main river current. From local experience, staying southwest of the line labeled "Western Limit of River Current" should work.

The racing area should be no less than ½ nautical mile away from the shoreline. The ½ nm mile Offshore line is indicated on chart. It is a bit closer than ½ nm to Four Mile Point where the trees aren't as close to shore as elsewhere.
