

## From Our DYC DHRF-I O Officer . . .

New Digital Race Start Timer

At the Feb 16 Board Meeting, the purchase of a Start Timer package to replace the Propane cannon on board Brutus was approved.

During my participation in the Sailing portion of the Canada Games at NOTL Sailing Club during August 2022, I observed the latest in the managing of sailing races. The Race Committee (RC) used a digital Race Starter. Essentially, it's a black box (literally and figuratively) fabricated by David Sprague, who travels all over the world managing races. The cost to DYC is just for the parts used in the fabrication, as David basically donates his time free. We are very lucky to have a fellow so dedicated to sailing in our area.

While I'm certainly not familiar with the details, it uses a physical horn(s), which sends signals from a computer controller/receiver (from NZ) and a battery. You can control the unit with a mobile phone through a software app. The box will be mounted on the roof of Brutus to give the maximum range. I certainly believe you can hear the horn from a distance around the Committee Boat, but since I have never raced with the device, I'm not sure of the range in different conditions. It seems to be as loud as the current signal gun. In any case the racers should be watching the flags. If there is an issue, I would think the RC could transmit the horn sound through the VHF radio on board Brutus for those skippers who have a VHF communications on Ch 68.

Below are some photos of the device. The device has been ordered from David and should be available well before the season starts. Although it is easy to operate, we will organize a training session with the designated person on Brutus when it becomes

available.


Trying to keep up with the demand for adult keelboat sailing lessons this summer, we have committed to having two Kirby 25 vessels lesson ready, and race ready of course! Also you can expect to see me out on our 420 fleet this spring doing plenty of testing!

The Repair and Maintenance Committee had its first meeting in February, where we discussed a prototype issue tracker and easy web form for submitting descriptions of things that should be addressed around the club. We will be coordinating with other IT initiatives like an asset management system.

The hope is that this will help get little things done quickly, like drilling gate peg holes, and minimize large repairs or hazards by establishing documented maintenance schedules for our large assets like docks, boats and cranes. The mast crane and dry-hoist will be inspected by KoneCranes in early March, in order to address any concerns and
