### Director at Large . . .

2012 - Ten years ago, I was Commodore of the Dalhousie Yacht Club.

We were a club celebrating our 75th Anniversary in which we held a memorable dinner and invited all the Past Commodores in recognition of their role in the success of DYC in the Port Dalhousie

harbour & an open house with an "explosive" cannonade (literally) by our dear member John Young.

Under very normal conditions we were evolving as a board & membership. Fund raising was King & we managed to involve most of our membership with full influence from Roberta Fitzsimons in various events held throughout the year. Roberta we miss you. There were no cash reserves and upgrades were beautification at best & Brutus of course! However, we developed a strong member following both old and new. This is a priceless asset for a club.

Roll in 2014 - business as usual at DYC, money is tight and the Flag and board do their best to keep it all together – that's their job right! Things get a little trickier in 2015.

2015 – the DFO, Department of Fisheries and Oceans, closed the piers to all traffic due to major structural defects – Let the games begin!

2016 - was good and bad. The bad first – the whole North shore boating community thought DYC was closed along with the piers and in fact, so was Port Dalhousie which reflected the major changes in our town with many restaurant and store closures. The good news was the DFO rewarded the 1st phase of the pier rehab to Rankin Construction, replacing the sheet pile wall in front of the club. DYC begins to rebound.

2017 - Then the water rose... Even in shin deep water DYC was developing momentum – D dock was transformed with new pilings, a carefully placed crane block gave us a new roof for the Harbour Office & a new above ground fuel tank project was underway. Big changes for a small club. But we had major trouble – B dock, our newer investment dock had failed in a extreme ice build-up that winter & what was left of it was submerged and caused a significant delay to our spring launch. It was devastating on so many levels.

2018 - Somewhere in all this havoc a core group of members started a grass roots revolution to take back these docks & successfully raised them, to a suitable condition through December & January ... well fed on homemade soup & chili of course! East side washrooms were renovated from high water damage.

2019 - the water rose higher...skids were secured to the white safety railings in front of the club in order for boats to tie up, and the club house was sandbagged. Launch was delayed, but willing boaters stood in rubber boots in flooded C yard to assist their boats - could it get any worse!!!

2020 – Oh yes it can! Covid arrives in Ontario. Volunteer members continue unphased & a dismantled travel lift arrives on site! The future awaits and they are all over it.



The Foxes go digital and put The Sunset Dining Room on the map for a go to for local take-out. Covid provides us access to an expansive patio to appreciate our stunning location.

2021 - I can't begin to explain the countless hours & effort put forward during this winter to make the Travel Lift the reality it is today. The volunteer effort was of legend proportion & was integral in saving this club.

May 2021 – Inaugural Launch – what could be more fitting than North Caught to be the first boat splashed on this historic day. Congrats Wendy Northcotte!

2022 – Covid restrictions are lifted. The weather is perfect... the water level stable (for now) & pier construction is complete. We take off!!! Val Jack is ready with a stellar cruising schedule. Learn to Sail returns with weekend sailing lessons off the beach. What a heartwarming sight on a busy Saturday in Lakeside Park. Wednesday night racing is ramped up. Dock upgrades plus the completion of concrete walkway & removal of fencing on Lakeport access to Lakeside Park & Lighthouse Road, polishes our look & new boating members arrive & keep arriving.

The clubhouse is spruced up with many infrastructure upgrades including hardwood flooring from entrance to lounge. People take notice & our Social Membership explodes! The Flag & Board work to full capacity to capture the energy of the renewal of DYC. What a great job they did!

We have been here for 85 years! We have weathered many storms and will weather many more to come. It has been my honour to be part of DYC and my reflection on the last 10 years only captures such a small portion of the effort & energy put into our club by members.

As I heard recently, it's because we as members all have something in common no matter how Barb different – we love this place!

We are beginning the process of developing short term, mid-term, and long term planning for our Infrastructure at DYC.

The first step is logging all of the bits and pieces around the club, the big and the small, so that we can determine life expectancies

and realistic replacement timelines, as well as making sure there are appropriate maintenance plans in place so that we get the most out of all of our assets. This will allow us to develop a framework for expected costs, and to allocate funding for improvements and upgrades as we go forward.

The largest, and most important part of our Infrastructure are our docks. We cannot be a strong and vibrant Yacht Club, if we don't have docks! Dock planning requires a specific focus to work on design and layout, and to evaluate the options presented to us by various vendors in the field.

While all of this planning is happening, the club and our facilities continue to be used and age, so immediate attention to repairs and ongoing maintenance needs to continue. With three different focuses for our infrastructure, we have 3 different Committees operating to assist in planning/coordinating. For each committee, we would like to have a combination of Board Members and Club members, so that we have a greater collection of voices directing us forward.

Please reach out to me if you are interested in joining the Infrastructure Planning Committee, the Dock Replacement Committee, or the Repair and Maintenance Committee. I received a few names at the AGM, so am looking for 2 or 3 more individuals for each of the Committees. We will try to get rolling promptly with an introductory meeting in December for the Dock Committee and the Repair and Maintenance Committee. The Infrastructure Committee will have their first meeting in January.




Chart of Port Dalhousie 1839 showing entrance of 1st Welland Canal.

In Order to Keep All Our Boats Safe
Please . . . If you are in the yard,
take a walk around.

If something is out of place, let us know.



Only keep your boat plugged in if you are present in the yard.

Please either take your batteries home, take the cables off your battery or use solar panels to trickle charge your batteries. A short will be devastating for all boats.

Please lock your ladder to your cradle or jacks when you leave the yard. We do not want to have any unwanted visitors, boarding any boats. One unlocked ladder provides access to all.

Please Check your boat covers, ensure they remain tied securely. This will ensure they do not start flapping in the wind, causing abrasions on other member's boat hulls.

Lastly, please lock the gate behind you, if you are the last person in the yard, regardless of the time of day.

At this time of the year the PHRF-LO office in Toronto requests each Club to forward the results for the championship Wednesday night races, so that they can review and update the PHRF Ratings on your boat. As a member of PHRF-LO, at DYC, we are happy to fulfil this

obligation, in the interest of better, more competitive racing on Lake Ontario and more specifically at Dalhousie Yacht Club.

For those who are new to this sport, all boats "are not made equal", so in order that we may have competitive racing, PHRF- LO (Performance Handicap Fleet Racing- Lake Ontario) provides each boat with a rating that is worked out based on all the performance data that has been accumulated over the many years this organization has been in existence. The Lake Ontario branch is specific to The Lake and is one of many that operates in North America, as the conditions and the type of boats sailed vary.

I encourage anyone who races to apply for a PHRF certificate for the upcoming season. Your fee contribution helps maintain this important organization, so that DYC can continue to conduct racing on our little section of the water.

This past season, we registered 15 boats with PHRF-LO and while not all boats raced every week, for the first full season without COVID, we generally had a good many on the starting line. In past years, we had 20 plus and in the "good years" 30 plus boats active in racing.

We all hope we can get back into this mode and to that end, we encourage anyone who is even mildly interested in this great sport to "give it a go" in the FUN RACE Series held on Tuesday evenings and Sunday mornings. It's an ideal way to not only get out on the water more than once a week but also to improve your sailing skills, enjoy sailing with a group of friends as crew and meet a whole new group of fellow Club members. Just think of the new stories you can tell of your adventures, on and off the dock.






