### Safety Officer's Report . . .

Things are loosening up, slowly and measurably, but are still subject to conditions.

The clubhouse, including the bar area, meeting rooms and the restaurant (except for outdoor dining, take-out, drive through, or

delivery) remain closed to the members, with limited exceptions (such as use of washrooms or access to first aid). Providing fueling and boat docking services is permitted.

When using your boat for recreational purposes, "the person responsible for the boat or watercraft must ensure that the members of the group using the boat or watercraft are all members of the same household, unless someone from the group lives alone or is a caregiver". No excuses will carry much weight.

The requirement to Covid-ly 'sign-in' at the gates has not ended.

Regarding safe boating, when you are entering or leaving your slip, especially at A and B Docks where space is limited, take a look around before backing out. Not everyone has brakes (I know; I know!). And if you see someone in the process of backing/coming out/docking when you are ready to enter, consider taking a turn around the harbor to allow them time to clear. The current is constantly changing direction and speed, it often takes more than one try to 'get it right', especially when docking. So, please keep it simple by waiting a few minutes until things settle down/resolve themselves.

And ask for help when you need it. We all have experienced situations where an additional hand (or foot) can make all the difference, so don't be shy about calling out to those you see, when departing or arriving. And keep your head up when you see a 'situation' developing and lend a hand. But stay within your limits regarding strength and agility.

We've had some issues come up some gates and railings (less concerning), and some electric / power related ones (very concerning), so whether it's on the docks, in the yards or over at our buildings, if you see something, say something. Do it as soon as you are able.

Do your part in making DYC a safe, appealing, pleasant and friendly place to be. It's not like that by accident.

### Treasurer's Report . . .

With the reduction in Covid-19 restrictions, boats are now back in the water and we are enjoying the boating season.

The club revenue has seen increases from new boating and social club members, stronger gas sales, plus increased restaurant revenue from patio and takeout dining. As well, we have received additional Covid relief funding from the government and Ontario Sailing.

This additional revenue has increased our cash position to offset the club expenses, especially the cost of the Travel Lift and some infrastructure spending for the clubhouse and docks. With the expectation of increased revenue from the lessening of Covid restrictions on the restaurant, additional revenue may be obtained.

With the greater revenue, we expect to further reduce the need to dip into the reserve fund for the last Travel Lift payment in December 2021. We continue to be on track with our budget and have authorized several upgrades to facilities.

The next instalment of photos from Sandy Cline identified the float as appearing in the Coronation Parade of Elizabeth II. (attached photo).


The parade took place June 2nd, 1953 in St. Catharines.





### DYC Racing 2021 . . .

Looking for a fun sailing challenge? Head out around the marks when you are out on the lake for a sail. If you haven't put these marks into your GPS yet, give it a try and challenge yourself to go through all the points of sail.

Then when you'd like, we'd love to see you out there joining the fleet. Oh the stories that follow!

The Race Course is counterclockwise around the white numbered cans northwest of the Dalhousie Channel entrance. Keep the marks to the port side of your boat.

The **Start line** is between mark 4 and an offset mark approx. 100 yards SE of #4 or if this offset is not in place, start line is between mark 4 and the north side of the outer range light house. Mark 4 can be seen about 400 yds west of the end of the west pier.

After the start, proceed to marks 3, 2, 1, 8, 7, 6, 5 and 4. The start line also serves as the Finish line.

Finish by rounding mark number 4 on either port or starboard, crossing the finish line in either direction.

### **Distance Races 2021**

Distance races will be held on the last Sunday of the month at 11 a.m. (cell phone time/ GPS time)

NOTE: to be scored you must submit your finish time by Email to Imcintosh2@cogeco.ca or text to 905-933-8327

New Addition this season: MANDATORY MAN OVER BOARD DRILL Each Distance race. EACH BOAT MUST COMPLETE A MOB drill during the race at any point in the race, OTHER THAN the turn around points at Port Weller or the Beacon.

This involves tossing overboard a floating object (such as a life jacket or an unruly crew member), putting the boat through a 180 degree turn to fetch the object, and after recovering the object, continue with the race.

## Stories from the Squall

Hi Len,

Trust you and all the rest got back safely. That squall was forecast to go north of us but it didn't!

We started on time, but soon had to get the Genny down, but it jammed!!

After 47 years of sailing Sirikit, we got the jib halyard jammed at the top of the mast between the sheave and the cheek plate, probably because we were taking it down in a howling gale while on a broad reach spilling all the wind from the main sail and still healed over to bury the side rail.

The tension sideways on the halyard got it derailed. We disconnected the sheets and let the Genny fly for a while, which damaged it. Then Chris gathered it somewhat and put bunnies around. We got to our dock with a tail wind and engine in reverse, as the partially ballooned jib still pulled. But we got managed to get docked.

Thanks to my crew and JB, we got the mast down, fixed the problem and mast back up before sunset. That was a first-time event that ended well. Thank God! Horst

PS - we had not time to check the radio, so not sure if you issued a cancelled action?? Horst

#### Len's Squall story

With a squall warning on my hand held and the skies getting darker at 6:20, I put my sail cover on (a signal that I wasn't going out). I was NW of number 4 and a few minutes later rain drops began, at which point I headed in.

At 6:28 the squall started building, fortunately it was relatively flat water.

At 6:30 I took that photo five minutes later, half way to the pier the squall hit full force directly on my stern, I was motoring at 5 kts and was then pushed up to 6.5 kts with torrential rain and the wind blowing the tops off the waves (gonna guess 40kts).

Up the channel was slow going with 10 or 15 degrees of heel and wind on the starboard bow. North Caught, Didge and Hip Hip came in 20 - 30 minutes after me.

Grace Blue finished at 8:15 p.m. , I haven't heard from the other two.

Happy to see us at near capacity. New members are arriving every week on their sail or power boats. It's important for all of us to

remember the slips we're assigned to can change throughout the season and from year to year. Some slips are better suited for shorter boats and others for longer ones. Some slips are shallow and others deeper, some are wider and some narrower. Some slips we try not to assign or can't because they are too narrow for two boats. Some areas of our club are not safe to leave a boat tied up to or may need some work before they can be assigned. Some slips have 50-amp service now and others are not as close to power and are better suited for day sailors.

All this means is that I have the tough / crappy job of having to tell members where they can tie their boats in our docks. I do look at best fit, I'm not always right in my decisions and am always happy to discuss options that help make our members boating seasons as enjoyable as possible.

Thanks for all of your cooperation.

This next note works for anything and anywhere in and around our club property, if you see something that needs to be fixed, replaced, changed or moved, please report it to <u>yard@dalhousieyachtclub.com</u>, <u>dock@dalhousieyachtclub.com</u>, <u>membership@dalhousieyachtclub.com</u> or <u>harbour.office@dalhousieyachtclub.com</u> so that it can be assessed and tracked to correction. This is REQUIRED. We must know what work is being done, before it gets done. A quick fix is one thing, but if we don't know that a quick fix was made and it happens over and over again, then we have a bigger problem that we will need to address and implement a permanent fix.

Power on our docks and around the yard is not as simple as in your home (well maybe it is), but you should not attempt to fix an issue with power on your own. We have a few knowledgeable members who have the knowledge and skills to work on some of the power around the club. These members work with the board to trouble shoot and work on some fixes, but unless you have been asked by the board to do any of this, please call first.

Ok, fun times to come. Fun racing has begun, next... cruising. Can't wait to see you out there.

### Dinghy Dock Report



Thanks again for all of the input. I was expecting to test things out tomorrow, but since the forecast for tomorrow is not looking power tool-friendly I snuck out of the house to work on the dinghy launch platform this morning.

The ducks thought that they would help me get the launch platform out of the water by weighing down the water side, (I am not sure that it helped... but it did not really hurt either.. so that was fine).

I installed some of the structure brackets that Scott contributed



frame walls so that I could organize the ropes that keep the floaters in place.

I was also able to fasten the dock ropes in a way that they are holding the bottom of the frame up.. allowing the top of the platform to move

away from the wall as the platform pivots while launching dinghies... and most importantly, is now able to do that without the platform surface at the wall dropping below the land ramp while under load.

The turtle has been very interested in this project... and seemed to approve with the state of the floating platform at the end of the day (which is good, because all the turtles that I have known, have been very picky about the behaviour of their floating platforms).

The floating platform is currently tied to the rebar loops along the travellift wall and that is working very well. The only thing I would change is to

add some kind of a clasp shackle to the rebar loop to save wear on the rope and make it easy to release and move.

There are still structural improvements that I can make to the platform, but they do not affect the behaviour of the platform (yet.. not urgent), so I will pick away at those things as I get time (should be all done this week).

The position of the floating launch platform allows for a 4' wide floating dock to run beside it (north side) in the travel-lift well. I would like to start working on that next, if we can collect requirements and requests for the configuration of the floating docks. I talked with a few people today about fixing up the current floating docks and dividing them back into smaller pieces so that they can serve multiple purposes based on need. If we can decide what we want to do with them, I would be happy to work with the travel lift crew to get the floating docks into the yards, so that I can work on them and then put them back in the water with a new lego-piece kind of configuration.

It was a real pleasure working at the club today and I had a lot of great conversations.
