

Good manners require that a member unable to participate


will send his/her regrets to the Commodore.

General plan: listen to via VHF radio - channel 68

- 1. The fleet assembles outside of the piers at 15:00, east side or west side, weather dependent.
- 2. The Commodore's vessel will circle the fleet at 15:30 and Reverend Karen Orlandi will conduct the Blessing of the Fleet, followed by a brief speech from the Commodore.
- 3. The Commodore's vessel will return to the harbour and moor at the patio in front of the Clubhouse, while the fleet waits for the signal to begin the parade.
 - 4. The fleet then parades into the harbour (three boat-lengths apart).
- 5. Continue up the west side of the harbour and round the temporary marker in the channel to port.
 - 6. Salute flag on the starboard side, as you travel down the east side of the channel.
 - 7. Continue back out of the harbour and wait until the last boat in the fleet joins you out on the lake before returning to your dock.







Commodore's Report . . .

Good Day DYC Members, Families and Friends,

The start of the boating season has brought so much life back to our yards and on our docks. I hope you've all had a chance to enjoy some early summer weather, either on your boats, or maybe on our Sunset Patio. Just like the water levels in our harbour, there are many moving

items that I would like to share with you and hope that we can get your support on.

West Side Washrooms - The larger temporary double washroom trailer will be replaced with a single washroom trailer, to get us through the last push to complete the WSW. Hopefully this will not be for long, but that will depend on getting your help to finish the new washrooms. Please keep a close eye on your emails for requests to help. So many of you have already been out a few times now, but there is still lots of finishing work to be done. If you haven't yet volunteered and you have some basic skills working with tools and home renovations, tidying the workspace, then come out and help our Lead Volunteers for Electrical, Plumbing and General Carpentry.

Security - As you are aware, we are a yacht club with docks and yards that are quite open to the public. It is not uncommon for there to be some unwanted visitors onboard while we are away. These are more typical for the very beginning and end of our seasons when fewer people are around. This year we have experienced something uncommon with a number of break-ins all along the harbour edge from cars, to boats and buildings. We believe these were all related and have been handled by the NRPD.

Our safety and security is a priority to all of us and I believe we are all working together to find the best solutions possible. WIFI in support of security cameras has been raised by many and there is a committee working on a longer-term solution, however the previous setup, although not very fast, was something and is being reinstalled once the West Side Washroom is at that stage (very soon).

Our floating docks do require constant attention due to the changing water levels, please report anything you feel needs attention or that you have attended to, to the harbour office, VHF 68, or by calling (905) 934-8325 ext. 24. Leave a detailed voice message, if staff are serving other members when you call, or you can always send them an email if you like to harbour.office@dalhousieyachtclub.com.

Now on to more fun and enjoyable topics. Our social events have continued to bring new and exciting entertainment. I'm excited for our Sail Past, please register your vessel and reserve a table for the dinner event following the parade through the harbour. Sunset Sailing will begin soon, keep an eye out for your opportunity to either host or be a guest for an evening out on the lake.

Thank you all for ALL your investment in time, effort and skill sets. It is amazing what we have here at DYC, fantastic views, delicious dining, Youth and Adult sailing programs, but most impressive is how all of this is done by our membership. Special thanks to my Flag, Officers, Board, Committees, Staff and all the many, MANY members who sign up and join in to get it done! Yes, I'm talking

Members please be sure to make your time count, as we are compiling approximate hours our members have invested to keep our club running well and looking great. As we all know, DYC is a volunteer run club and I think it would be interesting to know at the end of the season just how many hours our members share of their time, expertise and energy. It would be shocking, I think, to also roughly calculate the cost savings to all of us. If you've offered some time and energy, however that looks, please let me know, everyone's time is valuable.

With so many new Full Boating Members joining our docks, I'd like to remind everyone how tight it can be on the west side when leaving your dock or coming back to your slip. With the ever changing current and the breeze, at times it could get very difficult to manage coming and going with two boats aiming to move at the same time. I'd like to suggest, when you are still in the channel and returning to your dock to take a good look when entering that tight area. If any vessel is backing up, on their way in or out of their slip, just wait in the channel area safely, giving that boat in A and B docking area the space needed to maneuver around.

Lastly, as Leigh mentioned when you are walking the docks, keep a sharp eye out for pinch points of your extension cords, missing lynch pins on the end of the dock pins, dock chains that are too tight, and tires that fend off the dock that are too high or too low. Please address it or let us know.

The easiest way to make a report is by using the new members' app. The app includes a "Report Issue" function that lets you snap a picture and will record your exact location. So, with the app, minimum typing is needed to report a problem.

Whether you use the app or not, please report any problems you find as soon as possible.

If you're hearing about this app for the first time and you would like to be enrolled as a user, please let me know. (Note: you need a gmail, microsoft or apple email address to use the app.)

Register online: decals@cbp.dhs.gov Cost: \$32.62 this year. They will mail the decal to you. If you visit before getting your decal, you can show your proof of purchase receipt.

We are reimbursing their registration fee and they will be given an Adult LTS Complimentary Membership until August 31, 2023. WHAT WE LEARNT ON OUR EARLY SEASON CRUISE ~ Chris Turner and Claire Camden

In mid-May we joined our fellow intrepid sailors (May is cold this season) to travel to the Island Yacht Club on the Toronto Islands. The following is a list of the items **we missed** taking to this event.

- A micro heater. It gets cold overnight. Even with the heater we borrowed from Doug and Patti-Jo , our homemade block ice in our cooler easily lasted 3 days. Thanks to the Chambers, we were able to dry our clothes and sleep soundly. We were envious of Doug's Turbo diesel heater (Home Improvements-Tim the Toolman Taylor has nothing on Doug's innovations).
- Prior to leaving, make enquiries as to the "musical" entertainment adjacent the mooring you are visiting. If your tired after your journey and you wish to go to bed early, you may be surprised.
- Don't assume there will be cooking facilities on site. Very important if all you packed was food
 to be cooked over a flame. Check if the Club has operational BBQ's or a restaurant facility early in
 the season. Some Clubs are busy with boat and dock launch and haven't had the member
 interest that early in the season. We were appreciative of a very accommodating vice
 commodore.
- Waterproof your hatches. Early in the season you may not have had the chance to check the damage to the seals over winter. Nothing worse than sleeping with a small water drip over your head or on the dry clothes.
- Pack a covid mask to reduce the number of midge flies you ingest during the mid lake no wind event, even in the pouring rain.
- Carry waterproof gear including shoes or boots that will remain waterproof over an extended period.
- Pack warm clothing including a wool hat, scarf, socks and gloves. You will need plenty of socks
 and gloves in case they get wet, from lake water and from sweat. Clad in layers for the different
 conditions you will encounter during the passage.
- Pack a table cloth for the meals on shore. Clubs don't provide cloths unless they have a very attentive staff or vice commodore that is available on site.
- Use thermos flasks for the voyage so you have hot drinks or soup to keep your inner self warm
- Hair dryer. Not all Clubs supply one or it may be too early in the season for them to have their washrooms and Clubhouse fully operational.
- Include sanitary wipes, scrubbing brushes, soap and washcloths to clean the boat after the midge fly invasion.
- If you go anywhere near civilisation and you intend shopping, it usually involves a walk; pack good walking shoes, layers of clothing and a shopping bag or better yet, a small backpack.

Just as a suggestion for DYC and our constant fight with Canada geese poop on the grounds and on the docks. We should invest in getting a couple of peacocks to roam the premises; they are territorial and will scare the geese away. I know where we can get chicks!! We can even winterise the birds to stay with James in the Junior Sailors Building.

At the end of the day, we thoroughly enjoyed the cruise. Our thanks to Sandra and Tri who organised and ran the trip and warmed us up in the mornings with the Nespresso coffee at 0830.

Looking forward to our next cruise where we will try to be more prepared.
