And so, another great year at DYC begins, starting with a wonderful turnout for the Annual General Meeting held in November. A new Board was installed with some new and some returning members. A sincere thank you to retiring Board members Peter Bennett (Rear Commodore), Len McIntosh (Secretary), Alan Crozier (Yard), and Chris Essig (Fleet), replaced by new Board members Jeff Newkirk, Connie Jackson, Tom Schulz and James Desjardins respectively.

Leigh Brown has taken on the role of Vice-Commodore. Directors Paul Demare (Treasurer), Thom Hounsell (Docks and Information Technology), Brian Fleming (House), Jeff Mackie (Food, Beverage and Entertainment), Kiki Klassen (LTS), Patti-jo Chambers (Membership and Communications), Jim White (Director at Large), and Richard Nowina (Past Commodore) completes the slate of a very strong Board.

Peter Bennett, with the help of Ron Critchley, Kevin Roach and Richard Nowina, are doing an awesome job of completing the installation of new fender boards in front of the Club House. This will give us much needed space for shorter term docking for the restaurant and gas bar.

The men's washroom in the Club House has been updated with new vanities and mirrors, toilet, paint and refurbished urinals, all with the help of Ron Critchley, Kevin Roach and Marian Markarian.

We are currently sourcing options and getting quotes for the much-needed replacement of the West side washrooms. Hopefully we will be able to replace the units within budget.

Thanks to a very generous donation of flooring from Michael Pulo, new flooring has been installed in the lounge area, front entrance, hallway and office. Michael has worked with a large contingent of volunteers to install the flooring, and he continues to work on the finishing details. The plans are to replace the flooring in dining area in March.

Past Commodore Richard has taken on the role of coordinating DYC's role with NOTL in hosting the sailing (racing) events of the Canada Summer Games being held next summer. Richard has received a good response to his recent email concerning member participation.

At the end of last season, we reached a milestone of having no docks available for potential new members with boats over 27'. This is good news but creates challenges when responding to new full boating member applicants with larger boats. We are currently drafting the necessary protocols in order to fairly and consistently address this issue with new and existing members. More to come.





Vice - Commodore's Report . . .

Things that flow and other things that boats tie to -

Over the past year we've worked with Rankin and built a brand-new travel lift dock and used it both at launch and Haul Out with great success! This took a large DYC investment, both financial and with hundreds of volunteer hours from a group of skilled members. The hours invested by our volunteers is being paid in thanks and on occasion, a celebratory beverage. But, Rankin, required payment and with some surprises lying beneath the surface, that payment was steep.

That said, we have watched our docks fill up over the season and with these new full boating members, we increased our Dock and Storage revenues. This along with outstanding harbour office sales and some ingenious back-office work, we've been able to pay Rankin off in full without having to dip into our Capital Development Fund, despite getting membership approval last year.

Now, with initiation fees re-introduced for new full boating members, along with our storage savings and full docks, we will see our Capital Development Fund grow towards our goals of replacing some of our more tired docks. We will continue to move forward with plans to update our infrastructure, with a strong focus on the west side of our harbour, adding communal spaces for gathering and more importantly, a west side washroom replacement with discussions already underway with our partners at Rankin.

Adjacent our docks, is our yards and again over the past year or two we've seen some great progress by way of cleaning out abandoned boats and their forgotten about parts. "A" yard was regraded and partially paved. We've been able to fill our yard with new and existing member boats using our very own travel lift... a travel lift that was dismantled, transported to our yard and rebuilt this past winter, might I add. We've worked hard and should celebrate our successes!

Hopefully, we continue to improve on our ability to store even more of our members boats in our yards, possibly by complementing our travel lift with additional equipment and give our existing equipment the attention and care they so deserve. Our electrical panels in and around our yards are showing their age and may need to be replaced in some cases. The harbour walls need fenders mounted and cleats installed so that we can safely accept more transient boats from around the lake. These are some of the many opportunities you will have to join a work party or two to keep busy, stay engaged and have fun with your fellow members this winter.

I'm looking forward to my new role as Vice-Commodore and can't wait to share more good times with all of you.

History Matters . . .

Photo 1, from 1937 shows the NS&T (Niagara, St. Catharines & Toronto) railroad freight shed on the east side. (Hamilton Library photo)

DYC began in 1937. A 20X 20 shack clubhouse, was built on the east side farther north of the NS&T building.



Next page, (Photo 2, picture from Sandy Cline) dinghies were the only method of accessing boats, since they were on mooring cans on the west side.

Walk-aboard docks, wooden precursors of "A" dock, were only constructed in the early 1960s.

The club approached the NS&T in 1947 to see if we could store dinghies in part of the shed.

In 1948 a request for the full freight shed to become the new DYC clubhouse was made.

Neither the dingy storage, or clubhouse deals happened.



Call for Volunteers for the August 6 - 21st, 2022 Canada Summer Games - Sailing Series

Across all the Events the Games Organizers are looking for about 4,500 volunteers. To date about 2,500 applications have been received. This is well above to-date expectations.

For the Sailing series, the following describes what DYC volunteers are expected to contribute.

We would like our volunteers to be able to work the Sailing event for all of the days [from Sunday August 14 to Sunday August 21st](#) . The day may start about [8am](#) and go til evening depending on weather, role and needs.

Roles available will mostly be on the water on a Race Committee boat (it may not always be a DYC boat). Tasks can go from driving a boat, assisting on the Signal or Finish boat with flags, sounds, recording and anchoring. It may also be on a mark boat setting/ retrieving marks, on a safety boat doing almost anything to make the racing run smoothly, to rescue work. There may also be some limited boat and equipment preparation on shore.


We are looking for people with current (or lapsed) Sail Canada Accreditation as Assistant Race Officers (ARO), Course Race Officers (CRO) or better, as well as Assistant or full Mark Layer accreditation (AML or ML). We will also train and upgrade training for all volunteers and other members who wish the training, even if they can not commit to volunteer the Games and may not currently be accredited.

All volunteers will need to have, by August 2022, a PCOC (Pleasure Craft Operators Certificate), as well as a VHF licence as they will be using a VHF radio (most will). They will also need some sort of background check as we are dealing with youth and some games oriented training. These are usually managed by the overall games group and supplied by them as well.

There may be some other on shore needs for volunteers to assist in the administration of scoring, launching of boats and other athlete assistance etc., but they have not been scoped out completely yet.

If someone **cannot** commit for the whole games, we may be able to make some exceptions, but the Games organizers are not granting us exceptions easily.










Sean Furniss DYC Race Chair 2022
