Our boating season has officially begun!



The whole process was well received and Reverend Orlandi did an outstanding job with the blessing. The afternoon and evening concluded with comradery at the docks and in the clubhouse, followed by a full house for a great dinner prepared by Fox Foods. Many thanks to Jim and James for coordinating invitations and events and making the day a success. We indeed made the best of a sunny, but unfavorable very windy day for Sail Past.

The following Saturday, Tracy and I represented DYC at the Fifty Point Sail Past at the invitation of Commodore Brian Weber and his wife Ruby. The weather was perfect. It was a traditional event with a twist. We followed the Commodore on a walk around the harbour accompanied by bag pipe music and the blessing of the fleet on land. This was followed by the saluting of the vessels out in the lake aboard Commodore Weber's 45' Carver.

Dave Pressley, with some help from Fleet Captain James Desjardins, worked on designing and installing a secure sinking launch platform at the travel lift dock that also provides a longer-term solution for the launching of small boats on trailers. Many thanks to Dave who came up with the final design, resourced the materials, built and installed it with the help of James, Dale Jack, Tommy Rees, and Cheryl Ross.

Yard Director, Tom Shultz, is leading the charge on getting "C" Yard prepared for the addition of new gravel, while Rear Commodore Jeff Newkirk works on getting new fencing gates installed to improve security.

As part of the process of organizing the Learn to Sail fleet and dinghy membership, James is working with Diederik and his staff to work on recovering and restoring the industrial shelving that has been stored in A yard.

As always, much is happening thanks to a dedicated Board, great volunteer members and the work of our new Supervisor, Diederik, and summer students.

Another photo of our mooring field. It is earlier than 1949, since the clubhouse is still just the original 20 x20 shack (in 1950 the dining room was added).

The visible passenger boat, SS Northumberland burned in 1949 across from the Club. Older locals will notice the Port Hotel which predated the Port Mansion.

The small bridge (middle of the picture) was the remnant of the channel to Lock 1 of the first Welland Canal. The wheel structure, in shadow, dominating the lower left of the photo is the device to open the lock gate of the second Welland Canal.

**Thanks for signing into the new members' area!**

Hello all. Last month, I invited each member to sign into the new members' area and create a new password for membership. About 50 boating members did just that, and I thank each and every one of them for doing so. If you have yet to do so, please check your email for a message from admin@mydyc.ca sent about a month ago. It includes Sail Plans.

Now that the docks are full, it's particularly helpful to the harbour office to let them know that you'll be off the dock for one or more nights. One of the new functionalities in the new members' areas is an online tool for filing sail plans. Look for the "Add a Sail Plan" link in the members' area. The form takes seconds to complete and you can edit/delete your sail plans as you like.

Here's what the sail plan form looks like. Boat and member details are pre-populated. Remember to hit the "save" button.

### Filing Sail Plan Helps Harbour Office

Your sail plans help the harbour office know where to put guest boats and how many more guests the docks can hold. On busy weekends, your sail plans may mean the difference in deciding whether we can take one more guest. So basically, you're a superhero for filing sail plans!

### If not Online, then by Phone or Radio

The Harbour Office has the ability to file plans on your behalf. So, if it's not convenient for you to file a sail plan online, it's still a good idea to phone or radio the harbour office and let them know your away plans.

I am very happy to announce that youth Learn to Sail is back at DYC!!! The time has come to sign your kids up for sailing classes this summer! Lessons will be available on a first come first serve basis as spots are very limited!

If you plan to be away, please let us know so we can fill your slip.


