The Spring Members Information Night **April 13th 2023 at 6:30** will be your chance to find out what this year's boating season will look like and provide valuable input as DYC embraces change.

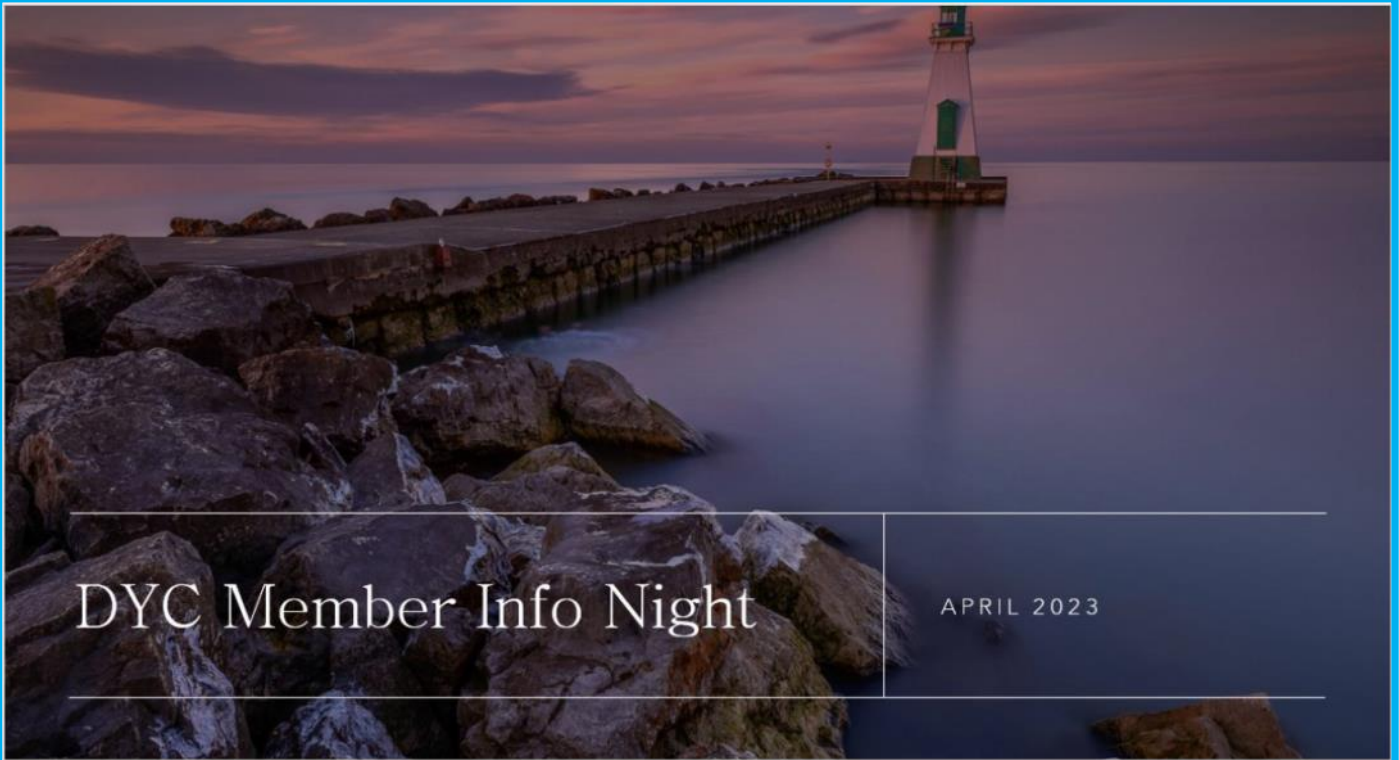

As we head into the 2023 sailing season, I will try to err on the side of communicating too much, rather than not enough during this very busy time for our club .

The weather forecasts indicate that during this coming long weekend we are going to experience our last freeze of the season. With this we have secured the date of Monday, April 17th to have our outdoor water turned on, so that it will be available for our work in the yards and ready for us when we arrive at our docks.

Boat Launch 2023

Many hands are required to launch boats
and if you're comfortable and want to help out,
[sign up to help out.](#)

Boat Launch Guidelines

Prior to any boat being launched, the owner or his designate shall check-in with the crew.
Aim to be in the yard 1 hour before your projected launch time,
as the launch order could change and good weather can speed up the launch.
Your boat will not be launched without your presence.

Please support your fellow members and be prepared to stay before and after
your boat is launched, to assist other club members' launch their boats, as they did with yours.

Only owners/crew members directly associated and capable of assisting with launch should be in
the yard. Children and those unable to assist can wait on the walkways/pathways outside of the
lifting area. Once the boat is floating and the slings are removed, the additional crew may join the
vessel to move it over to its assigned slip.

You will need the following:

- Sling Stickers on hull/toe rail both sides – please ensure these are visible to ground crew
- have 2 lines tied 30' to 40' to bow and 2 to stern for managing in the travel lift well.
 - Unlock your ladder to access your boat and prep cradle to be folded + tied after lift
 - Hang fenders on port and starboard side, but not in sling areas.

Additional Preparations:

Start your engine in the yard (let it run for no longer than 15 seconds)
to ensure that you will be able to motor away from the launch area.

Please dispose of antifreeze solutions in an environmentally safe manner.
Take home any wrap, paint cans, rollers, containers. We aim not to fill up our garbage bin.
Clear your cradle/jack area of debris to ensure a clean yard before and after your launch.

Make sure that your boat name and the owners name are on the cradle.
Mark the cradle for bow and stern.

If you are antifouling under your pads, during the lift, be very careful not to get any paint on the
slings, as it could get on the top sides of the next boat to be lifted.

Make sure your companionway is unlocked prior to launch,
so you can quickly inspect the bilge for any water leaks once it is in the well.

Do not start your engine in the well, until you are instructed to do so by the crew,
in order to keep our slings undamaged.

Once you have secured your boat in its slip please return to the storage yard
to continue to offer assistance as required for launching the balance of the boats.

From Our DYC PHRF-LO Officer . . .

I hope everyone is looking forward to getting out of this cold snowy winter and undertaking a summer of sailing. I hope we can encourage more participants in racing during a full 2023 season.

To that end, I wish to invite all racers to plan early and to request a valid PHRF-LO Certificate prior to the start of racing season.

Generally speaking, if you wish to participate in either the Wednesday championship Club racing, the Tuesday and Sunday fun races, the long distance or any interclub racing, you will need to receive a valid 2023 certificate. Fun Race only fee is \$50.00 to cover the cost of a PHRF certificate.

This certificate gives your boat a handicap rating that allows the Race Committee to score your performance against your competitors.

Dalhousie Yacht Club pays a fee annually to belong to PHRF-LO, based on the number of boats issued a certificate. Therefore your racing fee will include the cost of the Committee boat, equipment, gas, marks, and awards and flags issued at the DYC Racer's Banquet at the end of the season for all races ~ Championship, Interclub special races and Fun and Distance races included.

For all DYC racing fees refer to the fee table on the web site.

Please send in your racing fees in, in a timely manner so certificates aren't delayed, as processing certificates at the PHRF level does require a week or so. Keep this in mind especially if planning to race outside of DYC. Please note, DYC Wednesday/Sunday race fees include the PHRF certificate fee.

If you haven't raced in a while, we will need to measure your sails or you could have your sailmaker issue a note and apply to PHRF-LO yourself.

Highlights of PHRF-LO, Spring Training held on Mar 25, 2023



PHRF-LO had their annual spring training session for Club Handicappers on March 25, in which they emphasized all boat owners participating in Racing on the Lake should acquire a valid certificate for 2023.

There have been a number of reviews by the PHRF organization, of the boat specifications in the past 12 months and so there may be changes in your ASP rating this season. Valid PHRF-LO certificates are issued annually to include any adjustments to the ratings brought about by rule changes or to improve data.

Boat owners who race, are encouraged to pay the annual fee, so that PHRF-LO can continue to research latest changes in technology and provide accurate ratings for your boat in the interest of fairness. The annual fee for belonging to PHRF-LO by member Clubs is based the number of boats registered in the previous year and is due in February. The charge is very reasonable when compared to membership into class associations and other handicapping authorities.

The ASP rating is for the boat, not the owner. The boat should be raced as supplied by the manufacturer and therefore, in all fairness, all the supplied equipment and furniture should be included. Boats stripped out for racing are strictly not legal and can be protested by other participants. While this may not happen at the Club level, its more competitive in inter-club regattas. Any changes to your boat keel/rudder, hull, propulsion, spars, sails (new or recut) for the 2023 season should be reported to your Club handicapper.

When sailing in 1 design fleets, PHRF certificates are not required. However when a 1 design boat is sailing in a PHRF fleet, a valid certificate is necessary. Typically Class association fees do NOT include for a valid PHRF certificate.

Relevant current measurement data to establish the most up to date rating for any particular boat includes: measurement of all mains - changes in 2020/2021

- ⇒ measurement of the maximum size headsail
- ⇒ re-measurement of spinnakers to provide mid girth (AMG) rather than maximum girth figures. MG to be not less than 75% of foot. (2022)
- ⇒ confirmation of symmetrical with pole or asymmetrical spinnaker (AMG>75% foot) with a bow sprit
- ⇒ NOTE: free flying sails with AMG < 75% foot such as bloopers, streakers including Code sails are prohibited.
- ⇒ confirmation of mode of propulsion - confirmation of the type of keel; types of keels have been expanded to include more types.
- ⇒ use of carbon fibre spars. (2023)

Most Club races are held in the evenings in a dying breeze. The Current ASP ratings are measured based on this fact. Point to point or regattas are usually held during the middle of the day, so the handicaps should be modified. If this scenario is part of your plans this year, inform your handicapper so that a suitable separate ASP can be provided.
