

Commodore's Report...

Boating season is just around the corner with "docks in" scheduled for April 23^{rd,} which will be coordinated by our Dock Director, Thom Hounsell, with help from Vice-Commodore Leigh Brown. Many volunteers are necessary to make things run smoothly so please help out if you are available.

Thom's dock assignment committee took on the difficult and time-consuming job of allocating docks according to best fit wherever practical, and for making it look relatively easy. Also, many thanks to Thom for all of the great work he has done using his considerable information technology skills to significantly improve the dock renewal process.

A committee consisting of Leigh Brown, Jeff Newkirk, Paul Demare, Richard Baker, Michael Pulo and myself have been forging ahead with plans for the replacement of the west side washrooms. Richard, a retired architect, has been instrumental in developing various design options for consideration and costing. Paul is in the process of getting quotes on the options, some requiring considerable member volunteer help with interior fit-out to save cost.

Once we have received estimates and solicited further input on preferable options, Richard will prepare the site plan and design drawings on the preferred option for the building permit application. If all goes well, and the washrooms can be replaced within budget, work will start on demolition in late Fall of 2022 with the new washrooms available in the Spring of 2023. Please keep in mind that there are many obstacles in the planning and building permit process that could derail the time schedule. However, we remain optimistic.

Past Commodore Richard Nowina, Leigh and myself are continuing with our lease renewal discussions with the City, with a meeting scheduled for early April to formally start the process.

On Saturday March 19, Ron Critchley and Richard Nowina completed the welding on 80+ feet of frames to support new fender boards along the east wall in front of the club house. Prior to this, 3 additional frames had already been welded to the seawall, which are now awaiting the fitting of fender boards. As mentioned in my previous update, other volunteers have been involved in moving forward with the completion of this important project to allow more boats to tie up on the east side.

I am very pleased to report that our new Learn to Sail Director, KiKi Klassen, is preparing a plan to allow a scaled down learn-to-sail program this summer. If you would like to assist, please do not hesitate to contact Kiki or any Board member.



House Director Brian Fleming, with the assistance of Barb McMullen, Dan Sundy, Leigh Brown, James Desjardins and Teresa Shouldice-Fleming have done an awesome job of clearing out and cleaning up the Board room in the club house. This now allows the Board to hold their April meeting in-person for the first time in almost two years. Work will continue over time as funds become available to bring the room up to an acceptable standard.

The Commodore's Ball will be held on April 9th to honour and recognize the great work done by Richard Nowina, with the unwavering support of his wife Pam. Tickets are going quickly, so if you are planning to attend, please contact the restaurant (Emily) as soon as possible.

There are a lot of other things happening because of the hard work and dedication of Board members working alone or with the assistance of member volunteers. I will save that for another update.

Thanks to everyone's skillful and talented efforts, DYC is improving every day and the stage has been set for a bright and financially sustainable future.



Yard Chair's Report...

One of the sure signs of the arrival of spring for boaters, aside from warming temperatures, is rising water levels. So far this seems to be a rather moderate rise, far from flood concerns at this point.

With boats still on the hard and in the interest of following best practice for boat yard safety, the Board of Governors has added two new rules to the "Conditions of Storage".

In case you did not receive this message by email, here are the rules:

Rule 12: Use of Extension Cord: Electrical power is allowed to be used on vessels only while someone is in attendance. Power cords must be in good condition and must not be left connected when the vessel is unattended.

Rule 13: Ladder Storage: Ladders must be stored and locked in such a manner that they cannot be used to gain access to boats.

Preparations are underway for "Docks In and Boat Launch". As warmer weather becomes assured, city water will be made available as well as electrical power. That being said, members will be needed to install pipes and to do additional yard maintenance. Please consider providing the Club with some valuable, much needed and "fun" hours between boat prep time. Specific needs will be posted soon.

DYC Sunday Morning/Tuesday Evening ~ Fun Races 2022 -

Once again, we are organizing the FUN RACE Series held on Sunday mornings and Tuesday evenings for those sailors who want to find out what racing is all about and for those racers that just cannot get enough. It's good practice for your skill as a sailor, skipper and crew and builds your confidence to go out on the Lake more often. All sailing boats are welcome.

The Sunday morning races start May 15 and Tuesday evening on May 17. They will continue to the beginning of September. All races on Sunday start at 1000 hrs on Tuesday at 1800 hrs.

Races are informal without a Race Committee or start boat. Basically you start at Mark 4, proceed counter-clockwise around all the marks 3, 2, 1, 8, 7, 6 to 5 and finish at mark 4. You take your own time and send the information to the convener via email. For more information read the Sailing Instructions (SI's) on the DYC website.

The only thing we ask is for the boat to be registered to receive a valid PHRF certificate. The Certificate allows us to handicap your vessel, so that even when sailing against other boats that are not the same class as yours, you can be competitive.

With the 2022 Racing Season About to Begin

I hope everyone is looking forward to getting out of this cold snowy winter and undertaking a summer of sailing. I hope we can encourage more participants in racing during a full 2022 season, uninterrupted by Covid or highwater levels.

To that end, I wish to invite all racers to plan early and to request a valid PHRF- LO (Performance Handicap Racing Fleet -Lake Ontario) Certificate prior to the start of the racing season. Generally speaking, if you wish to participate in either the Wednesday championship racing series, the Tuesday or Sunday fun races, the

long-distance races or any interclub racing, you will need to receive a valid Certificate. This certificate gives your boat a handicap rating that allows the Race Committee to score your performance against your competitors.







Dalhousie Yacht Club pays a fee annually to belong to PHRF-LO based on the number of boats issued a Certificate. The Club needs to recover the costs of the Certificates issued, as well as the cost of the Committee boat, fuel, equipment, marks, etc.

There will also be awards issued at the Sailors banquet at the end of the season for all race series. So therefore, if you use the certificate you should pay for it. For all DYC racing fees refer to the fee table on the web site. If you intend to be involved in racing outside the Club and not sail at any of the Club events, you will be also charged \$50.00 for your certificate.

So, apply early so we can issue the Certificates without delay. If you haven't raced in a while, we will need to measure your sails (or you could have your sailmaker issue a note), complete forms and apply to PHRF-LO. Hopefully this can be carried out at the Club at a convenient time for both parties but the process takes time. No doubt it is easier to measure sails before they go up, consider setting up a time for that beforehand.

The Canada Summer Games are Coming to Niagara!

The Canada Summer Games team for Sailing has been working hard the last few months preparing for this event. It is only 4 1/2 months away!! It's a great group of people who are dedicated to make this a great success for the youth who will come to our clubs. This major event leads up to the Pan-Am Games and potentially, the Olympics for the competitors. There are 15 major leads on the planning team – each person being responsible for a specific area. My role is similar to an orchestra conductor for land activities and as the lead contact to the Games organizers. Dave Sprague is the orchestra conductor of water activities. Dave Jones and Josh Wiwcharyk, both members of NOLSC, have a lead role within the team.

Let me introduce you to the boats and give you some information about the competitors that will sail at the Canada Summer Games. Competitors will start to arrive August 13th and leave by August 21st. Canadian youth will represent each of our provinces and territories – so it will be a busy week with a total of 78 competitors and their coaches (12). They will be housed at Brock University and

transported to and from NOLSC by bus daily. It will be a busy but exciting place. Each province will have a tent for competitors. Their boats will be dry sailed on site.

The Boats include:

29ers – The 29er is the small version of the Olympic class men's 49er and women's 49erFX. It is a two-person skiff where the crew trapezes while the skipper hikes from the wing. One unique feature in skiff sailing is that the crew trims the mainsheet from the trapeze, elevating the role of the crew compared to that in traditional doublehanded boats. The skipper and crew are on equal footing and developing a strong team that works well together is key.



Teamwork makes the dreamwork. (<u>29ers</u>) The launch area is the current sailing school launch ramp on Niagara River. NOLSC Sailing school is scheduled to end August 12th so the area is available. We are expecting 2 groups of 24 competitors in this group.

2.4mR - The 2.4mR is a single-handed boat that is ideal for adaptive sailing since the sailor does not move in the boat, and everything is adjustable from right in front of the sailor. Both hand-steering and foot-steering are possible. The boat is sailed without a spinnaker, but with a whisker-pole for the jib. This boat requires a special launch area with a hoyer lift which is necessary for some competitors to get into the sailboat. The launch area for this boat will be in the slip that is currently occupied by Meintje. We are expecting 7-10 competitors in this boat.





ILCA 7 This racing boat is formerly known as the Laser. NOLSC sailing programme has a number of them. We are expecting 12 competitors in this fleet, each representing a province/territory. The launch area will be the NOLSC current sailing school launch ramp on Niagara River.

ILCA 6 Formerly known as the Laser Radial. It has a shorter mast and reduced sail area. We are expecting 12 competitors in this fleet. The launch area will be the NOLSC current sailing school launch ramp on Niagara River.

Dave Sprague has identified that there will be two race courses. He is currently putting together the team of major and minor officials. The Canada Games requires a large number of volunteer officials for the on-water activities to be from all provinces, so volunteers will get to mingle and interact with many very experienced race volunteers. Dave is working with Richard Nowina in coordinating volunteers from DYC.

The NOLSC A Frame will become headquarters for race officials, protests and judges, as it is an accessible building. Accessibility is a key requirement of the Games. This is the only building that will be set aside for the week's events. Members at NOLSC will be able to enjoy their boats as they normally do although the hoist used by smaller boats will be used during launch and removal time by the 2.4mRs. Some equipment such as tents and port-a-toilets will probably start arriving about August 12th. The goal is to keep the Games as least disruptive to members so they can continue to enjoy the club and cheer on the athletes as they leave the dock each day and return after a long day of racing.

We are working closely with DYC and NOLSC to equip the race courses with the proper boats. A few members have volunteered their personal boats to help out. We are still in need for the following if you can help:

- 2-3 Rib/soft sided type boats 16-18 feet with suitable engine to carry 2 or 3 people.
- 1-2 hard sided boats that can carry 3 to 4 people each.

If you are able to volunteer your boat – please let me know.

I'll keep you posted monthly when I can. If you have any questions or concerns, please connect with me at the link above. I'll do my best to answer your questions.






