We are having a very busy season at DYC. The Harbour Office is pumping record amounts of gas and diesel, staff are performing well under the supervision of our new Harbour Office Supervisor (Diederik) and we are continuing to receive compliments on the level of service and condition of the Club.

The restaurant has also been very busy due to great food, an excellent and caring staff and a significant increase in social memberships. This bodes well for the overall financial sustainability of the Club and allows the Board to plan for maintenance and improvements to the clubhouse.

Member volunteerism continues to be strong as is evidenced by the great work recently completed by Tommy Rees and Dave Bellhouse on Dock 122. Doug Chambers also contributed by welding in place four cleats to allow boats to tie up safely. The dock looks like new. Great job guys.

Vice-Commodore Leigh, with the help of Harbour Office staff member Evan, reacted quickly to reports of a person floating well outside the markers at the beach. Brutus was on site, but was not equipped to nor did they have the personnel on board to pull a person out of the water. Using the club Whaler, Leigh and Evan were able to successfully rescue the autistic young man (Ryan) and return him to his very appreciative and emotional father. The young man in question was wearing a life jacket and apparently got pushed out by the current and offshore wind. Other than being wet and cold, Ryan was fine thanks to Leigh's quick action and very effective handling of the situation. Well done Leigh and Evan, you make us all proud.

If you have been near the restaurant patio recently, you may have noticed the new chain and signage designed to guide visitors along the waterfront trail and away from the patio and harbour office area. This was becoming an increasing safety issue, especially for bicycles maneuvering through the crowded patio area and for visitors walking through the fueling area. Many thanks to Jeff Mackie for taking care of this.

Membership Director, Patti-jo Chambers, continues to do an excellent job of vetting and processing membership applications. This is one of the many jobs that she does so well.

Thanks to volunteer Don Evans, application has been made for a building permit for the new west side washrooms. Hopefully we will be successful in getting the permit to begin work this Fall.

House Director, Brian Fleming, could always use help with maintaining the clubhouse. There is always much to be done, so if you have time, please join the list of dedicated volunteers to significantly contribute to the continues success of DYC.

I want to take a moment to thank Tommy Rees, Dave Bellhouse and Doug Chambers for completing some dock work on A dock with new chain connectors that will keep the chains off our tender A dock water line and for the rebuild of Slip 122, just south of D dock

by the Harbour Office. They could have just soaked up the sun, instead saw a job that needed to get done and made it happen. Thanks guys. Members, if you see something that you could lead a project to get done, please let me know.

I'm happy to report that the board although still keeping up with the big picture items, have for the most part been able to enjoy their boats and the summer, while our operational teams both in the club and harbour offices are managing the day to day. Thanks to Patti Fagan, Diederik van Dijk, Cameron Pauel and the rest of the summer student staff. You guys ROCK.

I'm getting ready to shove off for another Lake Ontario adventure and if you follow me online, I'll try to keep a daily journal going but, no promises. I know there are others that will be or have already done the same, please remember to let the Harbour Office know the dates you will be away and returning by way of call, email or best yet online, its simple and quick. https://mydyc.ca/index.php/my-sail-plan-list

You would have seen the email from our Harbour Office about what they are trained and able to do with our club boats, and I wanted to echo some of what's there. Our club boats and HO staff are not equipped or trained to provide a tow service, BUT if a person or persons require assistance, then any able body should answer the call. Here's a true story and example of when we can and should use our club boats.

On July 27th 2022 – It was Wednesday Race Night and while our team was putting Pablo 2 in the water, there was some commotion on the west pier. Three men were calling out, and running after Brutus as they made their way out the harbour. Brutus stopped to talk to the men as they pointed to the water off the beach. A person was seen floating far outside the swimming area markers. I knew that Brutus was not equipped to, nor did they have the personnel on board to pull a person out of the water safely, so I met Evan (summer HO Staff) at the HO and asked if he would join me for a ride out to offer assistance.

We quickly grabbed lifejackets and motored the Whaler out of the harbour to the floating person in the water. Upon our arrival, Brutus was there and ready to deploy their life ring. I called out and asked that they wait a moment until I spoke with the person. Ryan, was a young twenty something year old man, who we later confirmed with his father, is autistic. He was wearing a life jacket and must have been floating in the water when the current and offshore wind pushed him out further then he could swim in on his own.



Evan and I asked if he was ok and if he would like us to pull him into the Whaler. He confirmed that he was not injured, but cold. We then pulled Ryan into the boat and sent Brutus off to the center mark to setup for our race.

Coming into the harbour a man was waving us down from the west pier and when we pulled up to him, he introduced himself as the young man's father. Ryan confirmed. We let Ryan off the boat to his father's care. His father told us that he attempted to swim out to him (evident by his clothing completely soaked) but, just could not get out as fast as the wind and current was taking Ryan. You could tell he was very upset as he began to tear up and choke on his words. We assured him that Ryan looked to be ok and was just cold, that he should take off his lifejacket now and get dried off.

Evan and I returned to the Dry Hoist where Evan let me off and took the Whaler back to

dock.

Later that night as Pablo2 won our race, I thought two great things happened tonight. We may have saved a life and we certainly saved the race.

I must admit, I did feel a bit like these guys as we raced to the scene. ©





Yes, some of us are already planning for haul out, not that winter is close at hand, but there are some things that we need to know well in advance.

Boating members will very soon be receiving a request to review their information regarding boat, insurance and storage details.

The Thanksgiving Long Weekend is October 8th - 10th. We will be scheduling haul out on two weekends, the third weekend in October, the 15th and either the weekend before or the weekend after. Yet to be determined.

Hence, the question you will be asked "early or late" will help us to schedule this process.

Also, to facilitate travel lift movement, our preference is to place mast up sail boats in the south part of C Yard, therefore first out. So, try to factor this into your preference, keeping in mind, boats first out this fall, are last in, next spring. As well, last out this fall, means first in, in the spring.

Other yard projects in the works are; adding some gravel to the soft areas in C yard, upgrading electrical systems in yards and docks, and ongoing maintenance. We always appreciate offers of help, especially from those who have experience in these areas, or strong backs.




