Learn to Sail has found our new head instructor, and I am confident that we will find lead instructors in time to open registration for the summer. Our adult keelboat sailing program is in good shape with our two member instructors, Chris Hunter and Chris Treschak, returning this spring.

Speaking of keelboats, our Kirby fleet is getting some special attention from members of the racing community, and they are preparing for another great season of racing. We are hoping more of our members will join a crew. Wednesday Night Racing is more than just rounding the barrels, hoisting the spinnaker, and really honing your sailing skills; it's a whole lot of fun with a great bunch of friends. If you want to learn more about "Kirby World," come ask about it Wednesday nights over a game of cards or some darts.

Our social calendar is filling up with some great entertainment, cruises are scheduled, the website is getting a facelift, our DYC App is constantly getting upgraded, and repairs are being made. 



# DALHOUSIE

Attracts Much Attention During First Full Session

A bigger craft, sails bellying out, aweeps out of the harbour mouth into the lake. Two sleek motor diam. exhausts ... chattering. sharply and head into the wind, a striking contrast to the two nearby

ing hurry, interested spectators are watching four units of the district's newest marine organization, the Daihousie Yacht Club, take to the open water for soul-stirring runs, filling a sun-list afternoce to the full with something that poor landlubbers cannot begin to grasp.

Organized within the past year, the Daihousic Yacht Club is more than a vigorous infant. Five sloops, two yawis, a cutter and four motor-driven craft make up the enrolment of the club, which has set up its headquarters on the Michigan side at Foet Daihousic, and is rapidly forging shead, Some thirty members sail the twelve craft, headed by Commodore Frank Cornelius, well-known St. Catharines business man, whose smart little y aw 1, the "Drake", is a familiar sight along the lakefront.
