
NEW - DYC will be offering an adult dinghy course this summer! Watch the website for more information. Registration opening soon!

Hey there everyone! It's a pleasure to be serving on the DYC's Board of Directors for Fleet this year. For those who may not know me, I'm a fairly new member of the club. I was born and raised in Windsor, ON and have lived in St. Catharines since 2017. I spent my teens crewing on my uncle's Viking 28 sailboat, where we competitively raced across Lake Erie. Sailing runs in my family, so I decided to take sailing lessons in my early 20's. It took a while, but I was finally able to buy my very first sailboat in 2023: a 1973 C&C 25 built right in NOTL. I joined DYC right away, which was one of the best decisions I've made. After a lot of hard work since (and a MUCH needed boat name change), I'm excited to be making memories sailing BLACKBIRD around the lake with DYC.

As the new Fleet director, I'm charged with looking after DYC's fleet of club-owned vessels. Over the course of this year, I'll be working on a new comprehensive system to improve how we manage our fleet. This will include two main elements to start:

- A new DYC Fleet Inspection, Maintenance, and Repair Program. This will be a detailed manual with annual processes and procedures to make sure the fleet's condition is well documented, maintenance is completed in a timely manner, and repairs are properly completed when needed.
- Creation of a new DYC Fleet Management System. This will serve as a central database of fleet inventory data. This will help us with documenting vessel information, better understand the fleet's overall condition, and strategically plan and budget for future work when needed.

Organizing DYC's annual SailPast event also falls under the Fleet portfolio and is quickly approaching. This is an awesome event to formally kick off the boating season! Details to come, but I'm already pretty excited to see everyone out there!

Being a part of DYC has been such an amazing experience for me personally. I'm quite grateful to not only be a member of this amazing club, but also to contribute to its success as a Board member. Looking forward to another great year out on the water with you all!

Dear Members,

I am pleased to provide an update on our recent activities and outline the next steps in our Dalhousie Yacht Club strategic planning process, but first, what is a strategic plan? A strategic plan is a roadmap that outlines our goals, strategies, and actions to ensure the continued success and growth of Dalhousie Yacht Club (DYC). While we have already been implementing many initiatives that align with our strategic vision, this effort aims to document these actions in a cohesive plan that will guide our decisions moving forward.

Our first meeting was held on March 6, 2025. This was a productive start to our strategic planning efforts where we engaged in meaningful discussions about the identity and future of Dalhousie Yacht Club (DYC). As a start and to anchor our selves for future discussions, we agreed on our ultimate goal: ensuring DYC remains the community partner of choice in Port PAST COMMODORE - LEIGH BROWN Dalhousie harbour, and offering a vibrant boating community for our members and guest.

As part of our initial action items, committee members were tasked with conducting a SWOT analysis, listing DYC's Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. At our next meeting, the entire group will collaboratively develop a combined SWOT analysis in our next meeting.

To ensure we have successful planning I've asked Jim White and Lew Holloway if they would help guide us through the strategic planning process leveraging their extensive experience in strategic planning and facilitation acquired throughout their careers, as well as their eagerness to help, ensuring that every voice is heard and all opportunities are visible.

Lew Holloway, with extensive experience as CAO of Niagara on the Lake, General Manager of the Niagara Falls Bridge Commission, and current board member of the Peace Bridge Authority, has successfully led and implemented multiple strategic plans, emphasizing continuous review and thoughtful execution.

Jim White, Director on several nuclear projects and General Manager of technical business units, is an expert in strategic evaluations and audits, utilizing tools like Failure Mode and Effects Analysis, SWOT reviews, and Brainstorming. He emphasizes continuous reviews and inclusive facilitation of senior management meetings.

Each of our committee members brings a wealth of experience and expertise in strategic planning. I am truly excited about the opportunity to harness this collective talent to build a successful path forward for Dalhousie Yacht Club. Jim and Lew will help establish our next meetings and will guide us through future agenda items to include developing a combined SWOT analysis, reviewing and refining (if needed) our Vision and Mission statements, establishing our goals, and summarizing and finalizing the strategic plan for submission to the Board.

Members of this DYC Strategic Planning committee will be providing a brief overview of our progress at the Spring Information Night April 3, 2025, to keep the broader membership informed and engaged.

I'd like to thank our committee members for their continued dedication and contributions to this important process. We look forward to our next meeting and the collaborative efforts ahead.

Launch is not far off, and as we start preparing our boats for the Spring, as series of reminders for our Yards:

- UNPLUG You may not leave your boat plugged in. Your boat may only be plugged in during the day while you are present.
- LOCK UP your ladders and access gates.
- CLEAN UP around your boat daily
- PACK UP Tarps/winter covers/frames are not to be stored in the yard.
- PACK OUT There is no garbage collection, collect and take your garbage home or take to the dumpster in A Yard. No oils or engine fluids may go in the club dumpster.

We are a volunteer driven club, so once you have your boat under control and ready for launch, look and ask what you can do to help around the club. Join in with the major events by registering to volunteer on the website, or look up additional volunteer/job opportunities that need assistance. Financial assistance counts too! We are looking for Sponsors to assist with the Cornucopia Regatta on Labour Day Weekend, and Sponsors for our Learn To Sail Program as well.

From my professional side, some suggestions as you get your canvas ready for a new season. If you have a leaky top, the best weatherproofing is 303 Fabric Guard. It is best applied to a clean surface, and I suggest 2 applications. Just as good, and made by 303 as well, is the Sunbrella brand weatherproofing. For polishing your vinyl windows, 210 Vinyl cleaner and polish, or IMAR Strataglass cleaner and polish, are your best products for long lasting window protection. Davis Klear to Sea is also a good basic cleaner, but doesn't have the anti-static and water shedding properties of the first two. Zippers are best cleaned with soap and water, and should not have any lubricants applied to them.




LLOYD BURTON - 40 YEAR MEMBER

JOHN WILLIAM YOUNG (1924-2025)






